EnDow Workshop on the diligent search requirement and crowd-sourcing

Invitation

You are kindly invited to the workshop on diligent search on the 30th of June 2016. It is organised by the Institute for Information Law (IViR) at the University of Amsterdam as part of the EnDOW project. EnDOW is a collaborative project which aims to facilitate the rights process under the Orphan Work Directive's diligent search requirement for European cultural heritage institutions (CHIs) seeking to digitise their collections.

The requirement of "diligent search" laid down by the Orphan Works Directive requires in practice that a large number of sources are searched for right holders. EnDOW is currently preparing a crowd-sourcing platform to facilitate this process (more information on the project are available at http://diligentsearch.eu). To this end, the workshop will encourage informal exchange between the participating experts, following the Chatham House rules. Participation is by invitation only and will welcome up to 30 participants, including practitioners, policy makers and academics.

The diligent search requirement imposes significant costs on a CHIs wishing to make suspected orphan works available online. This one day workshop aims to explore the issues involved with a view of developing an online tool which can be used by CHIs to get support with this resource intensive work. Rather than performing the entire diligent search themselves, CHIs can ask their community of users to check sources on their behalf, thereby reducing the burden of the diligent search process. This approach is known as crowd-sourcing. The workshop will support the design of a crowd-sourcing tool by providing a clearer view of not just the legal requirements in the member states but also how clearance is currently managed by affected CHIs (best practice). Furthermore, the discussion will also focus on the specific requirements the tool needs to meet to make it as valuable and useful to CHIs as possible.

Against this background, the discussion will explore how diligent search works in practice from the view point of CHIs. Participants are invited to prepare and discuss how their institutions carry out diligent searches, challenges they encounter and how these relate to the possibility of crowd-sourcing at least parts of the search.
