☐ to facilitate the process of right clearance for European cultural institutions engaged in digitization of material contained in their collections.


Specifically, EnDOW aims at...

designing, implementing and testing an online platform to carry out diligent searches according to the requirements of Directive 2012/28/EU.





Key findings – I. National implementation

- Directive mostly transposed literally in national legislations
- **Subjective scope** (art. 1.1): more generally defined in AT; more specifically defined in PT and PL. Slightly broader scope in some MS (LT: + "research institutions"; FR: museums and archives not "publicly accessible); slightly narrower in others (CZ: no "films or audio heritage institutions"; SK: limited to one Film Institute)
- **Objective scope** (art. 1.2): changes in the definition of "cinematographic works", to make it consistent with national law (AT, CZ). The list is non-exhaustive in PT. Inclusion of other subject matter (PT: "flyers"; SK: "musical works in written form")
- **Permitted uses** (art. 6): "non-commercial use" limitation only for 7 years (FR). Exemplary list of permitted uses (PT)



Key findings – I. National implementation

- Soft-law instruments: detailed guidelines on diligent search available only in the UK. Sample list of sources in LT and EE. Guidelines "in preparation" in BE and CZ. Reference to UK guidelines in CZ and NL.
- Other regulatory schemes: alternative licensing scheme for Orphan Works (UK), Extended Collective Licensing schemes (UK, IE, SK and SE). Out-of-commerce legislation in FR, PL and DE.

Key findings – II. Sources for diligent search

- Legislation of 9 countries has identified the list of sources to be searched during a diligent search (UK, EE, FR, GR, IE, LT, PL, PT, DE)
- In 11 countries the legislation merely reflects the general provision of Annex to the Directive.

Key findings – II. Registration of diligent search

- Legislation of 6 countries provides for the establishment of a national database for Orphan Works (BE, LT, RO, IT, SE and UK).
- National databases currently operational only in SE (Swedish Patent, Trademarks and Copyright authority) and UK (IP Office)
- In SP: diligent search validated by Ministry of Culture
- In DE: information has to be reported to the Patent and Trademark Office




